MCCRANEY, DANIEL. (*East Kent.*)

S. of the late Hiram McCraney, Esq., of the Tp. of Trafalgar Co. of Halton. B. in Trafalgar, July 1, 1834. Ed. at the Oakville Grammar Sch. M. at Oakville, 1860, Janet, eldest dau. of the late George Ewan, Esq. Called to the Bar of Ont. Michaelmas Term, 1871. Was Mayor of Bothwell from 1868 to 1873. First returned to Leg. Assem. 16 Sept. 1875, to fill the vacancy caused by resignation of Hon. A. McKellar. Re-elected at g.e. 1879 and again at last g.e. A Liberal. *Bothwell, Ont.*

MCGHEE, ROBERT. (*Dufferin.*)

Father, a native of Scot. was one of the earliest settlers in Toronto Tp. B. there 24 March, 1834, and ed. at the Common Sch. Moved to Tp. of Melancthon in 1848. M., March, 1852, Martha, dau. of Saml. Hamilton. Is a farmer. Was a mem. of the Council in 1862, Reeve in 1865 of the Tp. of Melancthon, and Warden of the Co. of Grey in 1879. An unsuccessful candidate for present seat in Leg. Assem. at g.e. 1879. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g.e. A Conservative. *—Hornings Mills, Ont.*

McINTYRE, DUNCAN JOHN. (*South Victoria.*)

S. of John McIntyre of Mariposa Co. of Victoria, who emigrated from the Island of Tyree, Scot., in 1847, where he and his forefathers had for generations resided as farmers. B. in Tyree, Scot. in 1842. Ed. at the Common Sch., Mariposa, and at Toronto Grammar Sch. M. 1843, Margaret dau. of R. F. Whiteside, Esq., Mariposa. Called to the Bar, Ont., 1871. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g.e. A Liberal. *—Lindsay.*

McKAY, GEORGE PREVOST. (*South Simcoe.*)

S. of the late Capt. D. Grant McKay, a native of N.S., who came from the Province to U.C. about 1836 and took a prominent part in defeating the rebels in 1837. B. 7 Feb. 1840. in Tp. of West Gwillimbury, Co. of Simcoe. Ed. in the Common Sch. and in the Grammar Sch., Bradford. M., 26 Nov. 1828, Susie, dau. of Rev. John Dou-e. Is a mer-
