J. Gibb and colleague Notaries Public, bearing date at Montreal aforesaid, the fourth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, acquired by purchase from Mr. Edwin Atwater of the said City of Montreal, merchant, "Those certain two Lots of Land, situate, lying and being in the said City of Montreal; forming part of the 'Beaver Hall Property,' known and distinguished on the plan of the said Beaver Hall Property, as Lots numbers one and three, bounded in front by La-gauchetière Street, in rear by a new Street marked 'A.' on the said plan, on one side by Beaver Hall Terrace, and on the other side by property belonging to the heirs La-mothe; the boundary line on Beaver Hall
