The Third World's Christian Citizenship Conference

NATURE

A CONFERENCE—not a convention whose action is binding on participants, but an assembly for the promulgation of ideas, comparison of views and possible formulation of suggestive plans of action.

A CITIZENSHIP CONFERENCE, free from ecclesiasticism. Those taking part in its deliberations will speak and act as citizens. It will in no way deal with church creeds. It is to be a conference in the realm exclusively of citizenship.

A CHRISTIAN CONFERENCE, conducted on the basis of the principles of Christianity, in their application to industrial, social, civil and political questions.

AN INTERNATIONAL CON-FERENCE for all the peoples of the world. There is today a world opinion and a world conscience, forming a world tribunal to which all nations are more or less amenable.

THE THIRD CONFERENCE of its kind and therefore no experiment. At the first, in 1910, seven countries were represented on the program and 1,500 were in attendance; at the second, in 1913, seventeen countries were represented on the program and fully 15,000 were in attendance. No building in the city of Portland, Oregon, where the latter was held, was sufficient to accommodate the audience, and resort was made to the great Multnomah Stadium.
