

4. The Ottawa Journal of October 12th carried a report of a public meeting the previous night at Renfrew, in support of the local Conservative candidate, at which M. J. O'Brien, Jr., urged the electors to support the Bennett Government. The article is headed "Plant Will Close If King Elected".
