 in great demand and
 generally imported from

 Halifax, the average price
 of the same being \$100.00.
 After the month of October,
 when the fishing season
 would be over, those who

 woods in search of furs
 might proceed there,
 without however bringing
 their families with them
 and exposing them to much
 misery. The latter might
 subsist on fish, potatoes
 and other vegetables, the
