HOLLAND

Enery threats to the channel to ANTWERP Have been practically removed. Only a few German gun positions remain to be mopped removed. Only a few German gun positions remain to be mopped up. The port of FLUSHING has been cleated. British patrols have landed on the NORTH of BEVELAND Island. Farther EAST British troops are pushing into the town of MEIJEL, and have established bridgeheads across the MARK Carall on the way to the MAAS River. SOUTHEAST of AIX LA CHAPELLE American troops have made gains through the HUERTGEN Forrest, and have made gains to within eight miles of the town of DUERENL To the SOUTH French troops have captured BACCARAT in the VOSGES Mountains.

HUNGARY

Russian spearheads are within 20 miles of BUDAPEST.

GREECE

British patrols are within five miles of the YUGOSLAV border and have attacked retreating German near PHLORINA. Allied Naval craft are sweeping up a vast mine field outside SALONIKA.

ITALY

Heavy rains have bogged down operations but allied forces hold their bridgehead over the RONCO River and are threatening the FORLI Airfield. Three enemy destroyers have been sunk in the ADRIATIC.

BURMA

American Super Forts staged a heavy raid on RANGOON, flying from bases in India. In WEST BURNA Indian troops have cleared twelve miles of the road from TIDDIN to FORT WHITE.

CHINA

The Chinese say they have recaptured the town of LUNGLING on : the BURMA Road.

PHILIPPINES American troops are mapping the last Japanese on LEYTE Island and havenut of their escape route to the port of ORMOC. The Japanese say that their planes raided American bases on SAIPAN.
