Beloved, before we can enter into this special class, born again, filled with the Holy Ghost, we must turn our back to sin, the world, flesh, devil, and SELF—we must fulfil Romans xii. 1-2, "I beseech you, therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service." 2, "And be not conformed to this world, but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God."
