

ore can be seen. This vein can be traced to the extreme east end of the claim. The work done is still insufficient to disclose the full size of the main vein as the hanging wall only has been found. This is also the case on the R. E. Lee.

These two claims have always been held in high esteem, and were in fact originally bonded for a larger sum than any claim on the South Belt. Both claims are mentioned with approval on page 30 of the Report on the Rossland District by Mr. William A. Carlyle, Mineralogist to the Government of British Columbia, and in every review of the camp made by mining experts the two claims have been spoken of in high terms.

Many quotations might be given from the local press noting the approval of those qualified by experience to give an opinion on the great value of the two claims.
