The Council request a further conference, on the subject of the Treasury Note Bill. And then the Messenger withdrew.

On motion, *resolved*, that the privilege of the Members of this Houfe from arreft, in all cales, except for Treafon, Felony, or Breach of the Peace, exift during the Seflion of the Houfe, and for a convenient time after every prorogation or end of a Seflion, and before the time of the next appointed meeting, and that fuch convenient time is, according to the ufage of the Commons Houfe of Parliament, forty days.

On motion, resolved, that a Committee be appointed to wait upon His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, and inform His Excellency that, previous to the Houfe receiving the Meffage of His Excellency of the 10th February laft, relative to diffress different Perfons mentioned in the Meffage, the Houfe had voted the fum of 2001. for their relief, and that the Houfe will provide for the payment of the fum of 1001. advanced by His Excellency for that purpose, by a clause to be inferted in the Appropriation Bill.

Ordered, That Mr. Haliburton, Mr. Matshall and Mr. James, be a Committee accordingly.

On motion, resolved, that the Houfe will, To-morrow, take into confideration the Petition of the Reverend James Robfon, William Black, and others, Ministers of the Protestant Religion, not connected with the Church of England.

An engroffed Bill for the Encouragement of the Cod Fishery of the Province, was read a third time.

Resolved, That the Bill do país, and that the title be, An Act for the Encouragement of the Cod and Scale Fisheries of the Province.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the Bill to the Council, and defire their concurrence.

On motion, resolved, that the Secretary of the Province do furnish His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor with the names of all such Collectors of Impost and Excise, in the different Out-Ports of the Province, as have neglected to give the Security required by an Act, passed in the last Session of the General Assembly; and that His Excellency be requested to appoint other Persons in the places of those who have so failed to give Security.

Ordered, That the Clerk do furnish the Secretary of the Province with a copy of the foregoing Refolution.

Ordered, That the Clerk do prepare and bring in a Bill, for appropriating fuch part of the Supplies granted in this Seffion of the General Affembly, as are not already Appropriated by the Laws or Acts of the Province.

Then the House adjourned until to-morrow at eleven of the clock.
