The petition of the undersigned residents of Barr'd Islands and electors of the electoral district of Fogo, humbly sheweth that on March 31st and April 1st last, seventy-eight sealers of the crew of the sealing steamer "Newfoundland" died on the icefloes from exposure, and that in the opinion of your petitioners, Captain Abram Kean, Master of the "Stephano," was guilty of criminal negligence in relation to the said men, wherefore your Petitioners humbly pray that Your Excellency be pleased to direct the Law Officers of the Crown to take the necessary steps to test before the Courts the liability or otherwise of Captain Kean. And as in duty bound they will ever pray.

TIMBER AREAS

Including an application for what looks like an immense section, (but whose area in sq. miles is not stated) by the Belle Isle Straits Pulp and Lumber Co., the Royal Gazette contains nine applications for big timber areas mostly on the Labrador. These amount to at least 3,000,000 acres, an area equal to over one-quarter the size of this Island. They are mostly on the Labrador, and are mostly there can be no doubt whatever, wanted for speculative purposes, not for immediate development by the applicants. We have been for some time protesting against the granting of any more of our valuable resources in timber and minerals for "the mere song" required in the past. Some plan should be devised whereby the people of the Colony, the real owners of these assets of our should share more largely in these resources. Other countries are beginning to awake to the folly they have been guilty of, and we should be up and doing before "our orange is sucked quite dry." We are pleased to see that the Fishermen's Protective Union organ is maintaining a firm stand against such grants, and that one of the Government papers in the outports, the Bay Roberts Guardian, has a vigorous protest against our give-away-for-the-asking policy. We trust the matter will be brought up in the Legislature at its present session, and a resolution adopted prohibiting the granting of these lands unless very good reasons can be shown, and even then we should require a better deal for you for the granting, if there are of no value, speculators should not be allowed to palm them off on the unsuspecting public. If they are valuable, the country should get a fair share of the value that we have, hitherto got. It will not do to lock the stable door when the steed is gone!" (H. Grace Stoddard)

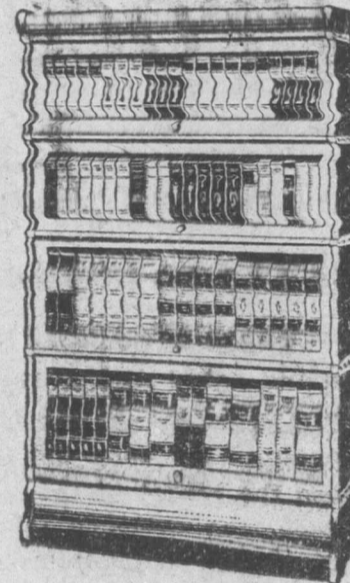
