They should be reimbursed the full value of the claim at any time within the period during which they might have sold had the officials not refused to enter the transfer, and also for the possible gold production of the claim during which work might have been done upon it had this complication not have made any outlay for labor and material too risky a matter.

The government has doubtless had an eye to its liability on the latter point, as it does not seem to have officially enjoined any of these mine-owners from working their properties. This is a small point, however, as the owner having this cloud thrown upon his government title by the government itself, how can he raise capital for conducting working operations? Some of the mine-owners have declared that they will hold the property and work it until action for ejectment is taken by the commissioner, but how much actual work has been done on these properties so tangled up in red tape is not known; under the circumstances little could be expected.

The concessionaire, too, seems to be waiting for developments; one party waiting for the other's first move and the government sitting idly by for the crucial sport to begin. The government at Ottawa has certainly known of this complication, due to its own carelessness, for these many months, yet it has taken no action of redress or correction. Rather it has thrown obstacles in the way of any settlement of the matter.
