He had shown a good quantity of excellent creamery butter made in his factory, fresh from the churn, and also had a Babcock cream tester in operation, showing how the crean is tested in the factory and how the

farmers are paid for it. The creamery is doing an excellent business both at home and in outside and foreign points. A large market has been opened up in Scotland and the demand is so great that Mr. Lister is not able to send butter fast enough to supply the increasing demand. The butter is made in churnings of 424 pounds each, sometimes

ings of 424 pounds each, sometimes more and occasionally less, acording to the quality of the cream.

Mr. Lister has paid for cream since the establishing of the factory \$30,-956.85. In July last year \$1,212.22 was paid for cream, while in the same month this year \$1,833.96 was paid out, so that the factory is not at a standstill but is growing. Farmers are finding out that it is far more profitable to them to sell their cream to the factory than to manufacture to the factory than to manufacture their own butter, and more of them are convinced of this fact every day and take advantage of the opportunity to make money.
