Happily through the spirited action of the British Minister at Weshington this danger was averted. Still, later, a book on the Northwest was published officially at Ottawa for orroulation in Great Britain, in which our Northwest was described as a savage wildernear, utterly barron and desolate, and only to be endured by missionaries who for the love of God would sacrifice, and only to be endured that her eastern sea board provinces, her lakes and rivers were but the vestibules and antechambers of that undreams of Dominion—no longer a mere estiler along the shores of a great river and lakes but the owner of half a continent, and in the magnitude of her resources the peer of any power on earth." Port Huron, Mich., July 2.—Railroad usiness—has practically stopped on the irrad Truck, 500 cars being tied up in the tunnel yards. The local men have not yet joined the strike, but the walk-out of all the mig at Battle Crock has paralyzed the road. The railroad company are not disposed to yield one tota. They have ordered the block I on shop and locomotive shops closed Fifty freight handlers and a number of switchmen were laid off.

Chicago, July 2.—The nc. is from the various roads, as summed up by the general managers, who are in close tole graphic communication with all lines, is birtify as follows:—The fillinois Costral and the Rock Island are in the worst straits.
