The specifications for a suspension bridge to be built over San Francisco Bay, between San Francisco and Oakland, call for a bridge 912 miles in length. The bridge will be supported by 10 piers, placed 2270 feet apart, and it will cross the bay at an elevation of 180 feet above the water. It will be the longest bridge in the world.

When Judge Lewis C. Bailey, of the Virginia Corporation Court, was sworn in at Alexandria for another term the old-time oath of office was administered. The oath—among other obligations, pledges the judge not to fight a duel or take part in one. He was also asked to swear that he had never sent or accepted a challenge to mortal combat.

China is not yet a formidable competitor by shipbuilding, but she should be taken of the construction of a large motor vessel built outside of Europe. It will be 218 feet long with 22 feet beam and draws 9 1/2 feet of water. Its speed will be 12 knots and the duty cost of fuel will be less than 250, which is considered very low for a 400-horse power steamer. A vessel of this type should be excellently suited for the China trade which has evolved into a large type of sailing craft, the junk. The junk is queer looking, but it is a very practical vessel. It has 100,000 tons of cargo capacity, and it is the Chinese water power.

The use of kites to carry a message to the shore for the transfer of passengers of steamships stranded, was advocated by Thomas A. Edison, of New York, after hearing about the steamer Uranian going ashore near Halifax with 800 passengers. The inventor declared that a law should be enacted to compel vessels to carry such kites. "When a ship is driven on shore, the wind is naturally blowing from sea toward the land," Mr. Edison said. "A line attached to the kite should be played out to a certain distance and then a hawser fastened to the kite should be carried to land, and the transfer of passengers to safety thereby made possible. In the same way a hawser could be used by the crew of a rescue ship to a stranded ship."

Four Millions Expended in a Single Year on North German Lloyd Vessel. The many cafes aboard modern liner have the atmosphere of the boulevard. The old, long, baronial board, presided over by the captain, to which passengers were summoned by bell or trumpet, has given way to separate tables at which one is free to dine, lunch, or sup alone, at any hour. In any set, any one of a hundred small tables seating two, or to join a party at a table seating seven, all surrounded by decorations that rival those of the best restaurants ashore. And as in any first-class hotel, the guest is not restricted to a table d'hôte menu, and can order from an à la carte bill of fare—but on shipboard all meals are included in the price of the passage. Cares for those who do not smoke, a new convenience, have the air of such places as Vienna. These are distinct from the opulent verandah cafes with their leaky tables.

Instead of the great fleets of 20 years ago, both cabin and steerage passengers are as free to the poorest traveler as to the richest, and the least interesting part of the ocean travel is that its cost is constantly growing less. The voyage to England now costs on the best ships about half the rate charged by the Britannia, the first mail steamer to cross the ocean, 70 years ago. One can go first class for three cents a mile, second class for half that, and third class with better accommodations than the best in the Britannia's day—for about 80 cents a hundred miles, and these rates include meals. Compare them with the standard railroad passenger costs and meals in the dining cars or station.
