"Majestic" Food Supplies.

FOOD BY THE TON FOR WORLD'S LARGEST LINER.

Food by the ton and in record quantities will be required to stock the larder of the White Star Liner Majestic, 56,000 tons, the largest steamer in the world, for her first round voyage across the Atlantic, which it is anticipated will take place in April next.

According to a provisional victualing list which has just been compiled, the Majestic's larder will carry far greater supplies than have been taken on any other vessel built. Figures based on the full number of passengers which the ship can carry at one time, 4,100, and a crew of 1,000, show that to feed 5,100 people for a single round trip it will be necessary to stock the ship's refrigerators with 75 tons of meats, besides 10 tons of bacon and hams, 28 tons of fish, and 18 tons of poultry.

There will also be included in the stores for a voyage 1,000 each of plover, quail, snipe, and pheasant, 750 each of partridges and grouse, and 500 wild ducks, a total of 6,000 game birds.

The vegetables to be served with these supplies will include about 30 tons of potatoes, seven tons of carrots and turnips, and about 10 tons of cabbages, besides several tons of onions and miscellaneous vegetables, including 1,500 pounds of hothouse tomatoes.

Fruits for the voyage will include 600 boxes of apples, 400 boxes of oranges, 60 boxes of pears, and one ton of hothouse grapes.

There will be one ton of ice cream, and of jams and marmalades to be served at breakfast and tea there will be three tons.

To supply the ship's tables with bread and pastry 35 tons of flour will be required for each round voyage.

The list of supplies calls also for eight tons of sugar and five tons of butter per voyage, besides three tons of tea and coffee, 80,000 eggs, and 500 gallons of milk.

For those who care for these things there will be put on board each voyage 80,000 bottles of ale and stout, 1,000 quarts and 1,600 pints of champagne, 1,000 quarts and 1,300 pints of other wines, 4,000 bottles of whiskey, brandy, and gin, and 300 bottles of liqueurs.

Smokers on board will be fortified with a supply of 250,000 cigarettes and 2,240 pounds of tobacco per voyage.—London Journal of Commerce.

Origin of Bride's Cake.

Long before the introduction of the wedding ring, some two thousand years ago, the counterpart of what is now known as the "wedding cake" or "bride's cake," was an established institution, although, like most customs that date back to the early days, it must be admitted that the precise origin of the "bread ceremony" at primitive weddings is shrouded in mystery. Among ancient writers on the subject, Quintus Curtius is probably the most definite and reliable, for he quotes the laws of Romulus, based upon those of the Etruscans and the other races whose advent preceded the foundation of Rome. In those days, it appears to have been customary for the families of the "young couple" to enter into certain prenuptial agreements for the future provision of their son and daughter—such as "showers" are given to the bride at the present time. These agreements were ratified in the marriage festival, and accompanied by a lavish out-pouring of corn, oil and other kinds of food, a ceremony which practically constituted the wedding itself.

Instead of adopting this elaborate process of joining husband and wife, Romulus devised a simpler method known as confarreatio, whereby the contracting parties simply ate a loaf of barley bread together and solemnized their union at once. This easy way of plunging into matrimony remained in force for many years among the Romans, but gradually, with the spread of more effete civilization, the loaf of barley bread was transformed into a cake of a more delicate texture and finally into the elaborately-iced structure which is now a part of every ceremonious wedding.
