In Columbia, Peru, Ecuador, and Brazil, ivory grows on trees. Chessmen, ornaments, buttons, drawerknobs, and other articles are made from this vegetable 'vory which, real ivory obtained from elephant tusks. It is gathered in the form of hard, white, fine-grained, oval nuts. about the size of a small potato, which drop from the wild tagua or ivorynut palm.
