The father and brothers came to this city to be treated at the Mercy Hospital, and as they traveled in steamboat and railway cars they spread the disease to others. Dr. McCune has written to Secretary Lee, of the State Board of Health, asking him to visit the valley and render State aid to the families of the victims. Over 40 deaths have occurred in the past week. Public funerals are prohibited.
