# JOHN HAUCH WAS KILLED BY BULLET

207 Dundas Street.

More Light on the Charivari Tragedy at Tavistock-Dr. Steele's Evidence.

Tavistock, Sept. 30. - There is no longer any doubt that John Hauch was killed at the Wagester charivari on Wednesday night by one of his companions, who carried a revolver, and, packed, removed or stored. Furniture repaired, refinished. 85 Bruce street. firing recklessly, pointed it at his companion. All that remains is to secure . > At Thursday night's sitting the coroner's jury, in addition to the formal evidence, heard testimony from the Rev. George Damm, of Creditton, one of the officiating elergymen at the wedo'clock on Tuesday evening, the young men forming the charivari party, were standing on the lawn to the south of the Wagester homestead. In the front were men with horns, fiddles and tin cans, while in the fringe of wood near the road were at least two men discharging firearms. That there were two

vas evident from the fact that in one case only a second elapsed between two shots. This evidence is regarded as conclu sive, because the antiquated pistol used by Hauch, requiring a new cap at each

discharge, could not have been fired so rapidly Dr. Steele, of Tavistock, who made the post-mortem, found the bullet that killed Hauch. It entered the arm six inches below the point of the shoulder, passed through muscles of arm and struck the shoulder blade, which changed its course somewhat downward. It entered the chest, pierced the upper part of the left lung and entered the aorta just above the heart It remained in this vessel, but dropped along it until it reached the lower part of the abdomen, where it was found in the left common iliac artery. Death was due to hemorrhage from the aorta.
