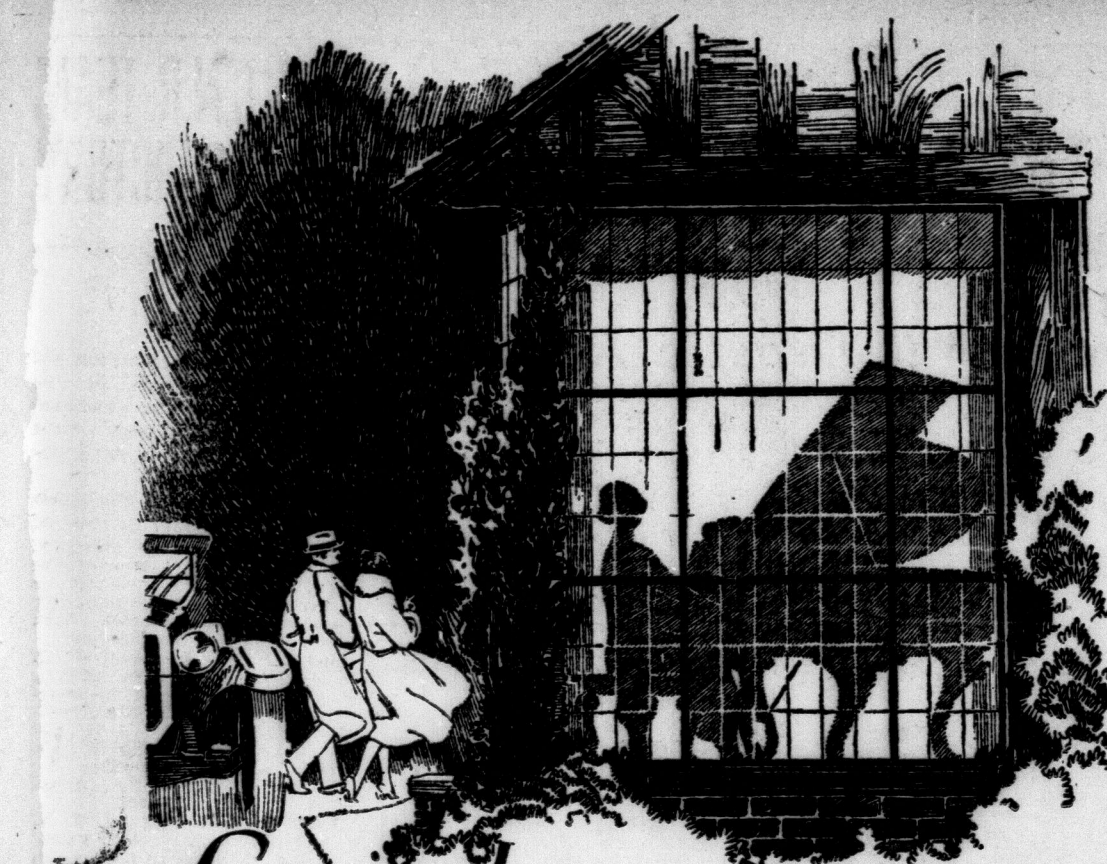

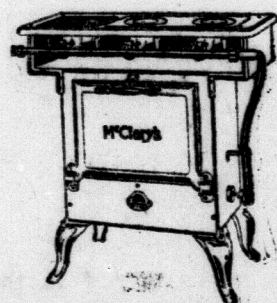

HYDRO IS MEETING INTEREST CHARGES

Latest Remittance Contains
Arrears On Thunder Bay
System.

Canadian Press Despatch.
Toronto, April 30.—The Ontario government today received the sum of \$4,378,397.82 from the Ontario hydro-electric commission, in payment of interest charges on advances by the government to the hydro enterprise. The remittance was notable in view of the fact that it included arrears of interest upon the Thunder Bay system totalling \$582,748.69. All the units of the hydro enterprise, accordingly, are now meeting their interest charges. The government's advances to the hydro now total \$142,714,107, the half-yearly interest payments upon this sum amounting to \$3,795,648.32. In view of the fact that the Thunder Bay system has now paid its \$582,748.69 interest, indebtedness to the government is now clear of debt in respect to interest charges, and henceforth will pay its way in the matter of interest as the other systems are doing.

PARIS GARRISON READY FOR MAY-DAY REVOLT

Mobile Forces Ready To Sub-
due Quickly Any Dis-
turbances.

Paris, May 1.—The entire Paris garrison, amounting to some ten thousand men, together with the whole police forces, has been assigned to barracks to prevent possible Communist outbreaks today.

Aeroplanes will fly over Paris, keeping constantly in touch with General Gouraud's headquarters, while motor trucks, provided with wireless, will be held in readiness to rush police and military forces to any point where disturbances may break out.

The police authorities have been busy lately searching houses of Communist leaders and removing trunks full of propaganda and documents. Although the police are silent regarding the contents of the confiscated documents, concern is shown by authorities, who heretofore were inclined to treat the Communist menace lightly, indicating that the movement is really serious.

Because of the measures being taken in Paris and the surrounding countryside, no serious disturbances are expected today, but there are indications that a serious movement is planned within the course of the next month.

EGYPT, ITALY AT ODDS OVER DJAGHBUB OASIS

Possession of Small Watering
Place in Sahara May Cause
Hostilities.

Cairo, May 1.—(Via London)—Egypt and Italy are making belligerent gestures at each other over the little oasis of Djaghbub, occupied by less than 150 Bedouin inhabitants, which lies near the Egyptian-Tripolitan border.

Troops of both countries are near the oasis, but each government refrains from occupying it for fear of provoking hostilities. In the meantime, the governments are exchanging tart notes and boundary commissions are unable to agree.

M. P. SUGGESTS LEAGUE DEAL WITH CURRENCY

Alfred Speakman Moves Can-
adian Delegates Bring
Matter Up.

Ottawa, May 1.—That the matter of taking remedial steps with a view of stabilization of the purchasing power of money should be brought before the league of nations through the Canadian delegates, under instructions from parliament, was the suggestion made to the banking and commerce committee of the house of commons today by Alfred Speakman, M.P.

Mr. Speakman moved as an amendment that this action be taken as an alternative measure to a previous motion by W. C. Good, recommending the calling of an international conference by Canada.

Considerable discussion followed in respect to the matter, but it was finally decided to postpone further consideration until the next meeting of the committee.

OTTAWA SUES COAL CO. FOR EXCESS PAYMENTS

Winnipeg, April 30.—A writ was issued late today in the court of king's bench by the solicitor-general of Canada on behalf of his majesty the king, against the Canadian Coal Sales Company, Limited, claiming payment of \$169,628 alleged to have been overpaid by the government on contracts by the defendant company for the supply of coal of specific name to the Tuxedo military barracks since 1920.

Hon. Ernest Lapointe, minister of justice, is named as prosecutor of the action on behalf his majesty.

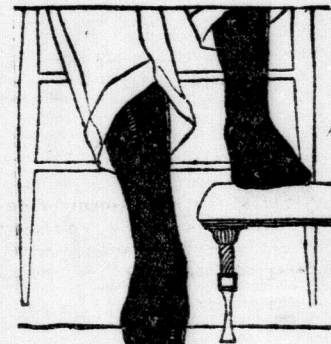

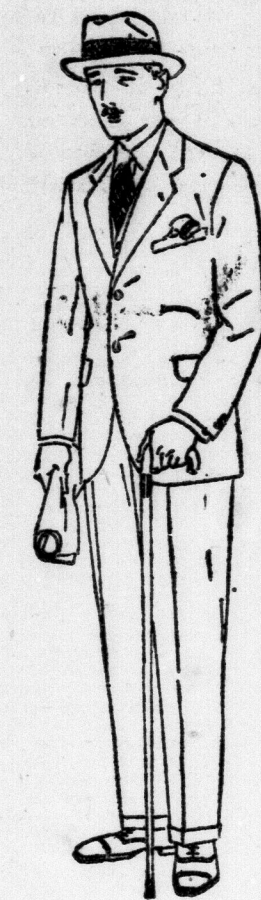

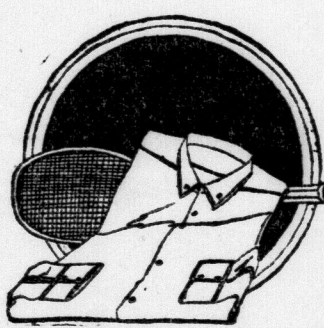
