Rumor that the Ontario Premier is to go on the Bench.

Toronto, Aug. 30.—According to a rumor here to-day in Liberal legal circles, Premier Hardy is destined for the Chief Justiceship of the Chancery Division, to succeed Chancellor Boyd. Mr. Hardy, who is a Grit lawyer, is to become Chief Justice of the Court of Appeal on the expected early retirement of Chief Justice Burton.

Toronto, Aug. 30.—The News this evening says: "The latest rumor in political circles is that Judge McMahon is being urged to leave the Bench and join Hon. Geo. W. Ross in reconstituting the Ontario Cabinet.
