

Crushing Out Revolt

Moscow Officials Claim to Have the Situation Well in Hand.

Strike Spreading in Poland and Preparations Made for Rising.

Fear That the Recent Issue of Bonds May Precede Financial Crash.

ST. PETERSBURG, Dec. 28.—According to a dispatch received by the government tonight the rebellion at Moscow is entering on its final stage.

The same guerrilla warfare was continued today, but on a smaller scale. Government forces, however, acting with great energy and hundreds of members of the 'Reds' are already behind the lines. The strikers have lost heart and the workers' council is considering the possibility of calling a general strike.

The principal danger now seems to be that the 'Black Hundreds' will complete the work begun by the troops and end the terrible massacres of the 'Reds.' These classes are represented in a working way by the attempt of the revolutionaries to overthrow the Emperor and even with the authorities to restrain the fury of these classes once the opportunity is offered them. The attacks made on the striking railroad men at warring stations shows the temper of the peasant classes.

Miles of Railroad Track Destroyed. Thousands of strikers marched out of Moscow and completely destroyed several miles of the railroad track between Moscow and the provinces. They are to be met by the Emperor's troops. Strikers bearing the 'Red' flag are being shot and about twenty miles to Olyne, whence it is understood, the troops are pressed on foot tomorrow to the destination.

The energetic measures taken by the government have completely overturned the plans of the revolutionaries here and practically all the leaders have been arrested. In the same manner, the Lithuanian insurrection, carrying out the plans for preventing the arrival of the troops, has failed.

THE DANGER IN POLAND. Today's news from Berlin indicates that the general strike is extending. Wholesale arrests have taken place in the Emperor's hunting lodge, an attempt being made to destroy the barracks with dynamite. The employees of the Liga-Orel railroad have again struck.

FINANCIAL CRASH PROSPECTED. Securities in the market show some advance today, but the market is still in the hands of the speculators.
