NEW RAIL SERVICE TO PACIFIC COAST

Canadian National Railways Inaugurate New Fast Daily Service.

CHANDLER WHARF DAMAGED.

Chandler P. Que, Nov. 8th. During a storm here to-day about one hundred feet of the Government Wharf was demolished and washed away.

This is a great loss, when for years we have been working to get the wharf extended so that the pulp from the Chicoutimi Pulp Co. could be shipped direct in steamers from Chandler instead of having to ship it on cars to Gaspe and then loaded on steamers.

If we had a wharf all the coal would be brought in by steamers. It is to be hoped that the Government will take this important matter up and build this wharf next year and help our industries and the Gaspe Coast.

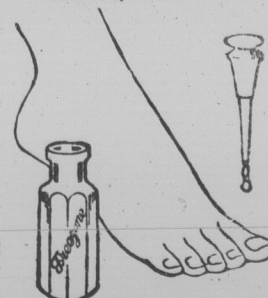
