THE NEWS FROM IRELAND. THE LAND COURT FULL OF ADJUSTMENT APPLICANTS.

Mr. Gladstone's Remarks at Knowlay - A Prominent Court Leiger Arrested - O'Connor in New Hampshire.

DUBLIN, Oct. 28. - There have been 2250 applications to the land court to fix fair rent. Thirty-three have been developed into proprietors. The classes is likely to prove abortive for want of response from the tenants. Four hundred landlords have intimated that they are willing to sell their estates, but not a single tenant has expressed a wish to buy. It is stated that every arrangement had been made to seize the United Ireland yesterday, but the appearance of the paper without leading articles non-placed the legal advisers of the chief secretary, and it was decided to postpone the matter. It is understood that the government contemplate the arrest of thirty-two presidents of league branches. Forster walks the streets unattended.

LONDON, Oct. 28. - Mr. Gladstone at Knowlay yesterday said the point was whether Ireland is to be governed by laws made by parliament or by laws known to the brains of a few persons, and enforced by an illegal, arbitrary, self-appointed association which sought to override by organized force the free will of Irishmen. It was a question between law and chaos. The thirty thousand applications forms issued under the land act, and which he anticipates a future of peace and prosperity.

GANNON IN NEW HAMPSHIRE. Mr. Gannon, N. H. Oct. 28. - O'Connor was met at the railway station by several thousand people and escorted to the hall by a procession of Irish-American societies and the local and foreign organizations. The line of march was brilliantly illuminated. There was much enthusiasm.

LATEST CABLE CHAT. Father Sheehy and Healy, M. P., leave Paris for New York to-day.

The British cavalry squadron has proceeded to the coast of Ireland. Cardinal von Haynott has been appointed secretary of the Hungarian delegation. Salisbury & Co. of London, merchants, have failed. Liabilities £180,000; assets £50,000.

It is understood the withdrawal of British troops from South Africa will proceed with all speed. The St. Petersburg court martial sentenced the leaders of the anti-Jewish riots to ten years' imprisonment.

There is still considerable dealing in Confederate bonds in London, with a slight improvement on yesterday's price. A column from St. Petersburg, Kairuan Wednesday without opposition, the insurgent retreated southward after pillaging the city.

The London Times says the time has now come when Lord Derby may be expected to take his position among the leaders of the liberal party and bear the responsibility for some time of the conduct of the policy he supports.

The Price of Coal. PHILADELPHIA, Oct. 28. - Committees of the Lehigh and Schuylkill coal exchanges advanced the eastern price of egg coal 20, and stove 10 to 15 cents.

The Monroe Doctrine Emphasized. PASADENA, Oct. 28. - United States Minister Murray, in presenting his credentials to the president of Colombia, made an assertion noticeable for its emphatic assertion of the Monroe doctrine.

The United States Army. WASHINGTON, Oct. 28. - The chief of the ordnance army reports for the year ending June 30, \$1,187,600 were expended. He recommends increased appropriations for equipping the militia, and says the efficiency of the army requires the retirement of officers at the age of 62.

The Cabinet Meetings. OTTAWA, Oct. 28. - The belief prevails outside that at the series of cabinet councils now being held several important matters, for some time left in abeyance, are being rapidly disposed of. These matters are said to include general and other appointments of general interest.

The U. S. Senate. WASHINGTON, Oct. 28, 1.30 a.m. - No indication as yet of an adjournment. Bayard and Vest made speeches, the latter intimating the intention on the part of the democrats to stand firm and prevent the republicans from securing a political advantage in Virginia by the appointment of Statham.

The Visiting Sovereigns. VIENNA, Oct. 27. - The emperor and empress of Austria, the king and queen of Italy, and a large number of nobilities and foreign and military attaches were present at the grand military review to-day. Their majesties were enthusiastically received by the public.

The Vienna Fremdenblatt says, "Henceforth Italy, in accord with Austria and Germany, will endeavor to preserve peace." Gambetta's Feeler. PARIS, Oct. 28. - The chambers re-opened to-day. Gambetta was elected provisional president of the republic by a vote of 317 against 29 in favor of Bisson, vice-president of the last chamber. The announcement was received amid great cheering. It is stated Gambetta will be the president of the chamber to test his strength with the deputies, as a prelude to taking office.

Louis Blanc attempted, but was not permitted, to move a resolution adopted in the morning by the extreme left, declaring the chamber was not to be dissolved by its predecessor, his object being to prevent the election of a provisional president. Brieux, Ferry, Proudhon, republicans, were elected vice-presidents.

THE FIRE RECORD. PARIS, Oct. 28. - The residence of Mrs. T. H. Metcalf, owned by Alfred Watts, was totally destroyed by fire last night. It appears that the servant after house-cleaning was putting up window curtains and accidentally upset a lamp, the contents of which took fire. She being excited threw water on the flames, causing the fire to spread. Loss about \$1500; insured in the Lancashire for \$700.

DONALD, Oct. 28. - At 9 o'clock to-night, the American steamer Island Cove, loaded with hay, bound for Ogdensburg, took fire when coming up the canal two miles east of Cardinal. Both steamer and cargo is a total loss.

A four year old son of Robert King, Detroit, very mysteriously disappeared a few days ago. The mystery has been solved by the receipt of a letter from the chief of police at Toronto stating that Maggie McDonald (the mother of the child) is in this city with a child answering to the description sent to him. King had lawful custody of the boy.

A MISSISSIPPI HORROR. A DRUNKEN CREW CAUSES A STEAMER TO SHAKE TO PIECES.

Terrible scenes on the River - The Number of Drowned Not Yet Ascertained - The Names of Those Missing.

DAVENPORT, IOWA, Oct. 28. - The steamer Gilchrist left here last night, bound up the river, loaded with a large, valuable cargo and carrying twenty-three passengers, four of whom were females, and a crew of fifteen.
