BOMBS FOR THE INFORMER.

PARIS STARTED BY ANOTHER ANARCHIST EXPLOSION.

The Restaurant of the Man Who Surrendered Ravachol to the Police Destroyed by Dynamite and the Informer is Killed and Several Others Are Injured.

Paris, April 25.—The restaurant of Vercy, who March 30 delivered Ravachol, the anarchist, into the hands of the police, was utterly wrecked at 9.40 o'clock to-night by a bomb which exploded in the kitchen.

The force of the explosion was terrific and widely felt and an enormous crowd quickly gathered about the shattered building.

The Informer Killed. The police on entering the restaurant in the midst of heaps of debris groaning with fright and pain. One of his legs had been broken, and he was sent to a hospital, where it was found necessary to amputate the injured member.

It is believed the explosion was designed to terrify the jurymen in Ravachol's case, which opens to-morrow.
