Toronto Synod got excited yesterday, not over the needs of the mission field, but about a gloomy balance sheet and an array of unproductive investments, especially the money sunk without hope of remunerative return in the building intended for a hotel at Jarvis and King-streets. Heated harangues were delivered alike by clerics and laymen, and the audit committee's report was taken to be read.

After this excitement such topics as the church's public house, the church property, church separate schools, Synod extravagance and half a dozen others.

Notice of Motion. That the standing committee on investments be charged with the duty of raising the capital of the Episcopal Endowment fund to \$50,000.

THE LIBERALS WILL BE DEFEATED

Prof. Goldwin Smith Casts the Horoscope of the Forthcoming Elections in Canada, England and the U.S.

Prof. Goldwin Smith has been interviewed by a Montreal Star reporter. Among other things he said, "I think the present Government will get back to power. It has all the advantages on its side. I have always observed that material considerations have more effect on voters than broad questions of public policy, unless, indeed, some burning question, in which all were deeply interested, were being agitated."

"Then you do not consider the trade question of sufficient importance?"

"No," said the professor. "The attitude of the Liberal party is too uncertain. They shift too often. They once had a good platform, commercial union; but they abandoned that for unrestricted reciprocity, and since that they have another change. I don't see how they can expect the Government to be elected in Ontario, but they will hold the Lower Provinces and Manitoba."

"You have no sympathy either way?"

"No. I am neither Liberal nor Conservative. I belong to no party."

"Have you taken much interest recently in United States politics?"

"A little. It seems to me that the Republicans will carry next presidential election by a large majority."

"The currency question may complicate matters a little, but I expect to see the silver men beaten."

"How do you expect the next British election to result?"

"I expect a small Unionist majority. There will not be a rout of the Liberal, or rather Radical, party."

"Do you think Mr. Gladstone will ever return to office?"

"I think he would if he were asked, but I fancy the party does not want him."

JAILED FOR KIDNAPING. An Alleged Graduate of McGill Found Guilty of Fraud.

In the second case there is an absurd anomaly, for the law proposed would be contradictory, prohibiting a man from serving in execution of a trust which he is required to execute and perform.
