(Circular) TO THE FRIENDS OF NATIVE INDUSTRY

IN CANADA. MEETING of the "Association for the Promotion A of Canadian Industry" will take place in this city on the 27th inst., and the Committee take occasion to address a few words to its members, and to manufac-

turers and others who do not belong to the organiza-

The business first to be transacted, will be the election of officers for the year; but the near approach of Confederation makes it necessary, at the same time, that special attention should be given to obtaining such an organization throughout the country, as will render itself effective before the Legislature takes up the subject of our tariff.

Your Committee has, in previous circulars, gone fully into the general objects of the Association, but the well-being of the country seems so deeply involved in whatever policy will soon be adopted by the Government, that they now enlarge slightly upon whatever has already been advanced. The construction of the present tariff shows an entire absence of any settled principles, in departing from those supposed to be attached to that of 1859; this stands out in remarkable contrast with what took place in Great Britain during the time of her transition policy, for with her the protective element was never lost sight of, till protection was no more required. Our object is to raise our voice against such indiscriminate legislation. Common prudence dictates we should not wait supinely for another blow to be delivered, but that ample information be afforded to all classes, and that these subjects should be well considered before another change takes place. It is apparently through your means alone that this can be effected, for there is a determination on the part of some of the leading members of the press, to stifle all discussion, while they systematically keep before the public a one-sided view of the case. This policy of theirs can be successfully met, if the proper means be used, and this narrowminded way of dealing with a topic of national importance, will, in the end, be made to react against those who practice it.

We now invite all friends to our cause who are already members, to give their support by their presence, and we solicit those who have not already joined, to do so at once. It we now unite, we will by welltimed action, render it impossible for the scenes of last session of parliament to be enacted over again. Then the government suddenly sprung a mine upon the people, and found no one ready to resist; individuals and hastily formed committees, rushed to the capital to remonstrate, but their unsupported endeavours proved of no avail in overthrowing a measure, which, if followed up by others of the same nature, must prove disastrous to the country generally.

The meeting will be in the rotunds of the Exchange, at 2 p. m., of Wednesday the 27th inst.
