CASHYERE shawls are made from the wool of the Cashmere goat, which lives in the Cashmere Valley, Thibet, and Tartary. Only the summer wool is used, and this is bleached by a preparation of rice flour. For each colored thread a different needle is used. The process is so slow that when the design is elaborate, the completion of one square inch will occupy three persons for a day, and a shawl of remarkable beauty would take this number of years for its execution. Only the loner kide of the showl is exposed to the view of the workman, he being guided by the patiern placed before him and a skillsupervisor of the work. Shawle that are worked with the needle are, however, far inferior to those In which the pattern is woven in.
