The moisture completely escapes ofter some time through the fine fissures of the coating. Finally, the coating is removed by the cautious use of sleobol, whereupon the organs will present their original sharp outline. It is desired to give them a better appearance, they may be coated with a thin layer of an adhesive varnish and dusted with a suitably coloured metallic bronze powders. den
