

CREAM TARTS.—Make a thin puff paste, cut small, bake and fill with whipped cream, on which drop a spoonful of acid jelly.

CHEAP RICE PO MING .- Two quarts of milk, two-thirds 'A a cup of rice, same of sugar, small piece of butter and a little salt, stir it occasionally until boiling hot, and cook in a slow oven until the consistency of cream.

CHOCOLATE MACAROONS.—Three quarters of a pound of blanched almonds, on pound of powdered sugar, one-quarter of a pound of grated chocolate, the whites of three eggs beaten to a froth; mix all together to a stiff paste, drop them on a sheet of white paper on a pan, and boke in a moderate oven. moderate oven.

SAGO PUDDING.—Boil five tablespoonsful of sago, well picked and washed, in one quart of milk, till quite soft, with a stick of cinnamon; stir in one teacup of butter and two of white sugar; when cold, add six aggs well beaten, and nutmen to taste. Mix all well together and bake in a buttered dish three-quarters of an hour.

OATMEAL CRACKERS.—Take three cups of the finest oatmeal, one tablespoonful of white sugar and a little salt. Wet it up with sweet cream and let it sit in a cool place an hour or two, then knead in the fine flour enough to make a dough that can be rolled and cut. Roll thin, cut out and bake in a moderate oven about ten minutes.

CHICKEN PIR.—Boil your chickens until they are tender, and season highly, line deep pie plates with rich pastry; take the white meat and a little of the dark off from the bones, put into the pie plates, pour the gravy over the chickens, add butter and a little flour, cover loosely with a crust, and bake from half to three quarters of an hour.

COFFEE DESSERT Make a large cup of clear, strong coffee. Put one ounce of soaked gelatin into a saucepan, and add boiling water till there is one quart altogether. Sweeten to the taste, and when just to the boiling point remove from the fire and pour tnto a buttered mould. It is a rich, dark colour, and is most appropriately served with whipped cream.

WHOLE CHERRIES A LA VANILLE, Boil two pounds of sugar with two glasses of water, and clarify it with the whites of of water, and clarify it with the whites of two eggs. Skim the syrup and put it into four pounds of fine cherries without their stocks or stones, but as whole as possible. Add some fine extract of vanilla and let the whole infuse on the fire; but by no mears let it boil; let it infuse for at least five

SALMON SALAD .- Two bunches of celery and one very small head of cabbage, chopped fine, then add one can of salmon with the bones picked out. For the dressing with the bones picked out. For the dressing take one tablespoonful of butter, four tablespoonsul of sweet milk, four tablespoonsul of vinegas, salt, pepper and a little Frenchmade mustard, one egg. LEMON BISCUIT.—One and one-half cups of sugar, one cup of butter, four eggs, one and one-half pints of flour, one teaspoonful of extract of lemon. Mix the butter, sugar and beaten eggs together, add the flour sifted with two teaspoonsful of baking powder; flour the board and roll out the dough one fourth of an inch thick; cut out and lay on a greased tin; wash over with milk, and lay a thin slice of citron on each.
