Tan color, wood shades, light brown, pearl and putty shades are given the preference in prevailing styles of gloves.

Black undressed kid gloves with strtching in a very pale shade have been worn by young ladies at informal gatherings. They are becoming and stylish if they harmonize with the dress, but not otherwise. They have been worn with colors, but are much more suitable for second or complimentary mourning. Silk gloves are in very general use for warm weather, and the finest of grades of black silk gloves are quite generally worn.

A few very dark shades are also used, but are likely to become discolored by prespiration, and they are much less practical than good black gloves .- Philadelphia Record.
