FRENCH EVANGELIZATION.

MR. EDITOR -

In your last issue you published the decisions of the General Assembly regarding the work of French Evangelization. From these it will be seen that the funds for the Kunkikee Mission, and for French work in Canala, are united; that the Chatham Presby erg, and not Mr. Chiniquy personally, is to settle all legal questions a facting Church property at St. Anne, and that Canala is hereafter to enjoy the services of Mr. Chiniquy. The mission at Kankikee is not to be abandoned. It continues under the care of the Presbytery, and will receive such attention from Mr. Chiniquy as may be deemed necessary, while he is set free to labour chiefly thoughout
