Five Petitions were laid on the Table.

Mr. Power, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House, by command of His Excellency the Governor General, Annual Report of the Department of Pensions and National Health, the Canadian Pension Commission, the Pension Appeal Court and the War Veterans Allowance Committee, for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1935—(English and French.)

He also laid before the House,—Statement in respect to the Public Works Health Act, chapter 91, section 5, R.S.C., 1927.

Also,—Statement in respect to Regulations made under the Proprietary or Patent Medicines Act, chapter 151, R.S.C., 1927.

Also,—Copy of Order in Council, P.C. 3568, dated November 18, 1935—Regulations of the Department of Pensions and National Health "for providing burial expenses for former members of the Canadian forces and the Imperial and Allied forces who die in destitute circumstances."

And also,—Statement of Receipts and Expenditures for Sick and Distressed Mariners for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1935.

Mr. Howe, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Report of work performed and expenditures made as of December 31, 1935, together with the estimated expenditures for 1936, under authority of Chapter 12, Statutes of Canada, 1929, construction by Canadian National Railway Company of certain terminal facilities with grade separation and other works at and in the vicinity of the City of Montreal.
