FISHING VESSEL "GOLDEN SCARAB"

Question No. 87—**Mr. Crouse:**

1. What is the amount of federal shipbuilding subsidy paid to Scarab Fishing Ventures Ltd., on the tuna seiner *Golden Scarab*?
2. How many pounds of tuna were landed in Canadian ports by this Canadian subsidized ship since it started fishing operations?
3. How many Canadian fishermen are employed on the *Golden Scarab*, and what is the total number of crewmen?
4. What is the amount of the special subsidy paid to the owners of the *Golden Scarab* by the industrial development service of the federal Department of Fisheries?
5. What value was received by the Canadian taxpayer for this expenditure?
6. What are the names of Canadian government officials who accompanied the *Golden Scarab* on her first two voyages, and what were their duties?
7. Has any Canadian company indicated it intends to purchase the *Golden Scarab*?

Miss Judy V. LaMarsh (Secretary of State): I am informed by the departments of Fisheries and Transport as follows: 1. \$764,250.

2. Nil.
3. At last report 1 Canadian in crew of 13.
4. \$25,000.
5. The principals involved in construction of this vessel are proceeding with construction of a large tuna plant in southern New Brunswick. Furthermore, construction is proceeding in Canada of three 210-foot trawler seiner tuna vessels to supply raw material to this plant. An industry of considerable magnitude is being established which will be significant to the economy of the Atlantic region.
6. First voyage, G. H. Imbeault, technical officer, Department of Fisheries. Second voyage, Clarence Savoie, fisheries specialist engaged under contract with the Department of Fisheries.

Their duties were to observe and report on the operations, and to collect information useful in a biological and technological assessment of this new fisheries development.
