## PUBLIC WORKS—CONSTRUCTION OF BUILDING IN VILLAGE OF PORT STANLEY, ONTARIO

Question No. 1,210—**Mr. Wise:**

Has the government any plans to construct a new building in the Village of Port Stanley, Ontario and, if so (a) on what date is construction expected to begin (b) what is the expected date of completion?

**Hon. C. M. Drury (Minister of Public Works):** A feasibility study is currently in progress relative to the provision of improved postal accommodation at Port Stanley. The implementation time frame cannot be identified at present and will be subject to establishment of Canada Post Office priorities and availability of funds.

## NOISE LEVEL STUDY FOR CANADIAN NATIONAL RAILWAY, VANCOUVER

Question No. 1,212—**Mr. Huntington:**

Will the Minister of the Environment release the noise level study done for the Canadian National Railway on waterfront activity in the City and District of North Vancouver and, if the study is not available, for what reason?

**Mr. Len Marchand (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of the Environment):** This study was developed without consultation with the Department of the Environment and was funded by the Canadian National Railway. This department does not have a copy of the report.

## RELOCATION OF PARKS CANADA REGIONAL OFFICE FROM CORNWALL, ONTARIO

Question No. 1,266—**Mr. Cossitt:**

1. With reference to the answer to Question No. 1,045 to the effect that the Regional Headquarters of Parks Canada will be moved from Cornwall, Ontario to another more central location (a) on what date will this move take place (b) what would be the new location (c) is or has any place in the constituency of Leeds been considered for such location and (i) if so, what are all details (ii) if not, for what reason?

2. Will the government give immediate consideration to relocating in the constituency of Leeds the Regional Headquarters of Parks Canada now in Cornwall, Ontario?

**Mrs. Iona Campagnolo (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development):** 1. (a) No date has been identified. (b) The new location will be somewhere within reasonable commuting distance to the other federal government services from whom we require services and with the several departments of the provincial government with whom we have extensive co-operation and co-ordination in program achievement. Our investigations are centred within one hour commuting time of Toronto. (c) No. This would not provide us with the access to the provincial and other federal agencies mentioned in (b).

## ESTABLISHMENT OF NATIONAL PARK IN SOUTHWESTERN SASKATCHEWAN

Question No. 1,269—**Mr. Hnatyshyn:**

Is the government committed to the establishment of a national park in the grasslands area in Southwestern Saskatchewan and, if so, on what date will such a park be established?

**Mrs. Iona Campagnolo (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development):** The government is negotiating with the government of Saskatchewan to establish a national park in southwestern Saskatchewan. If the negotiations are successful, it is expected that a memorandum of intention will be signed in the near future. Until negotiations are completed, it is not possible to give a date for the establishment.
