Mr. Robertson (Shelburne) then moved in amendment, to leave out all the words after the word "that" in the said motion, and to insert the following instead thereof:---

"The general understanding since Confederation has been that under the Constitutional Act the Provinces have jurisdiction over the regulation and restriction of the issue of licenses for the sale of intoxicating liquors, the hours of sale, and certain other incidents of the business.

That the local character of the questions, and the use of the local machinery and institutions in dealing therewith show that the public interest will be best served by the continuance of Provincial jurisdiction over these matters.

That a question as to such jurisdiction having been raised in the Gracious Speech from the Throne, the action of this House should be in the direction of procuring the removal of doubts by the establishment of the Provincial jurisdiction, instead of assuming jurisdiction as proposed by the said Bill; "--which was negatived on the same division, as the last.

The main motion was then agreed to, and the Bill read a third time, and passed.
