so efficient in the investigation. The detailed proceedings of the committee are published every year, and if there has been no discovery of anything wrong, it is because there was nothing wrong to be discovered.

If such statements as I have quoted are believed by these to whom they are made, it is a case of the blind leading the blind. I find in the reported speeches and in newspaper articles much more of the same sort.

In a word, and as a conclusion of the whole matter, I claim that the Reform party has always been specially a farmers' party, while faithful to every other class as well; and that the Reform party is the true farmers' party.
