

SNOW COVERING PROTECTS WHEAT

Winter Crop in Excellent Condition—Corn and Oats Firmer.

CHICAGO, Feb. 13.—Ample snow covering throughout the winter crop belt gives wheat a down turn today. Closing prices were heavy at 1-4 to 3-8 net decline. Corn finished 1-8 to 1-4 up, and oats with a gain of a shade to 1-8 up.
