LEAVE OF ABSENCE GIVEN RESERVISTS

Austrians Who Own Trentino Farm Land Will Go Home.

ITALY TO BE NEUTRAL

Assurances Said to Have Been Received at Austrian Capital.

ROME, March 30.—The Trieste correspondent of The London Daily News reports that Austrian reservists who happen to own farm land in Trentino have been granted a fortnight's leave of absence in order to attend to their agricultural work. This measure is said to be based on the fact that assurances have been received at Vienna that Italy will maintain her neutrality and that the majority of the nation is opposed to war. It is a fact that the troops hitherto concentrated on the western front are being partially withdrawn. Austrians are still convinced that Italian intervention is inevitable and are continuing defensive preparations, who not in the Alpine region.

SKILLED MECHANICS SAIL FOR GLASGOW

Lack of Fair Wage Being Paid by Local Firms Contributory Cause. Twenty skilled mechanics, members of the Amalgamated Society of Engineers, leave Toronto Thursday for St. John, N.B., where they will take the Scandinavian, sailing for Glasgow. Positions are awaiting them there. They will take their families with them. This is the second contingent that has left under the direction of the A.S.E. The fact that a number of large firms in Toronto are not paying a fair wage is a contributory cause for the old-fashioned workers going back to the old country, where the government has authorized a fair rate of wages to be paid by firms getting war contracts.

SIR ADAM APPEALS TO PROTECT HYDRO

Forest Hill Railway Bill Finally Voted Out by One Majority.

AGAINST INTERESTS CORPORATION COUNSEL GEARY SURPRISED THAT IT CAME UP AGAIN.

Ever since the Forest Hill Railway bill was thrown out of the legislature, a week ago there has been an active lobby for its revival. Sir Adam Beck made this charge before the committee yesterday in an impassioned appeal to protect the interests of the Hydro. As evidence of his claim, men were even at the moment being intercepted in the halls and advice was offered as to how they should vote. After a most argumentative session, in which many strong things were uttered, the bill was given its final bump by a vote of 16 to 15.

Part of a Scheme.

To his mind the move was but part of a general lobbying scheme. In spite of protest he clung to that position, and went even further to implicate members of the committee. He thought that the days for this practice had gone by. He made it plain that any man supporting the bill was fighting the Hydro, and expressed his firm opposition.

Chairman Took Hand.

The chairman took a hand by stating that the Hydro would not be injured, but again the London members objected. Secretary W. J. Glover of the railway and sundry bills committee was hitting them hard, but it was demanded who stood behind the project, and another answer came. Wm. McDonald of Bruce stated that he came in to vote for the bill but had changed his mind, and for public exposure he had written a letter to the Hydro.

CITIZENS OF VIENNA MUST REMAIN IN CITY

Strict Orders Given That They Must Not Visit Hills Surrounding the Town.

ROME, March 30.—Citizens of Vienna are ordered not to visit the Vienna Woods on the coast of the city. These are favorite resorts in spring and summer. The authorities will run grave risk of being held responsible for any public demonstration if they are ordered to use the hills, especially at night.
