
The first electric railway for the carriage of nassengers was seen at the Berlin Exhibition in 1879. Shortly after, \$2,000 passengers were carried at the Exposition at Paris. They were not exactly toys, and yet they were not fullfledged. The distances were short, and the guage was ridiculously natrow. In May, 1881, an advance was made by the opening of an electrical railway in the suburbs of Berlin. It was 3 miles long, and the speed had risen to 30 miles an hour. The next electrical railwry ran to the Giant's Causeway, in Ireland. There realso little oads in Austria and Holland and poder the Thames. The last was successfully cpened in Cleveland, Ohio, about the middle of last month, America is not usually so slow in sing new things, nor have her inventors been backward in attacking this problem. Daft and Edison and Field have each declared their systems perfect. But we believe no electric lo omotive has yet carned a dividend. Dynamos eemed to be like racchorses—neither handsome or very useful at low speeds. When they are arnessed and brought down to practical velocies they are at a disadvantage. Obviously a comotive which shows its best results only hen rivaling the speed of a gale leaves someing to be desired. When such speed can be ed safely (as upon a miniature track designed of the carriage of parcels, such as, for instance, cils), extreme rapidity can be obtained. Mr. anchell, an Eaglishman, has devised a singleack railway of this discription, upon which he oposes to make 200 miles an hour. Perhaps department of electricity promises better an this one of transportation, although as yet
