If the prefent ministry should not have refolution enough to abandon the path of their predecessions, I cannot blame them.

The leaft knowing of you, can fcarcely be ignorant, that the circumftances of the nation are now very different from what they were when annual parliaments obtained among us. At that time, the Houfe of Commons was little elfe than a mere implement in the logiflature. The civil fubjection of its members, deprived it of all political importance. In confequence of the diffusion of property, it acquired political importance, and being cured of republican whimfies, has fixed the conflictution at the true poife of a mixed government. This poife produced a coincidence of the principal rights and interefts of the whole
