# VIOLENCE NOT SHOWN

Inquest on Body of Baby Found in in a Valise in Hamilton House.

HAMILTON, Sept. 26 .- (Special.)-An inquest was held to-night into the death of the baby which was found in a valise at the home of William Batstone, 80 North John-street, last week. The verdict of the jury was to the effect that there was nothing to show that the child had come to its death thru violence, or that it had ever lived. Detective Sayer testified that Miss Jessie Sweet, the girl arrested in connection with the case, told him that the child was hers, and that it was born at the Batstone home eleven months ago. Mrs. Batstone, however, denied the latter statement. Drs. Mc-Nichol and Edgar, who conducted the postmortem examination, said the little body was so dried up that it looked like a mummy, a condition that was unusual. They did not think there had ever been life in the body, but, owing to the condition in which they found it, it was pretty hard to tell whether there had been or not.
