

THE NIGGER BY LENGTH WINS \$2500 HANDICAP

Mary Davis Second in Feature at
Moncrief—Manheimer Makes
Track Record.

JACKSONVILLE, Jan. 27.—The Nigger, held at 10 to 1 in the betting, won the \$2500 Jacksonville Handicap, the feature event at front of Mary Davis, who beat Bob R. a length. Aldrian, a formidable Derby candidate, showed a fine performance when he picked up 118 pounds and beat a band of good horses of his age at 7 furlongs. 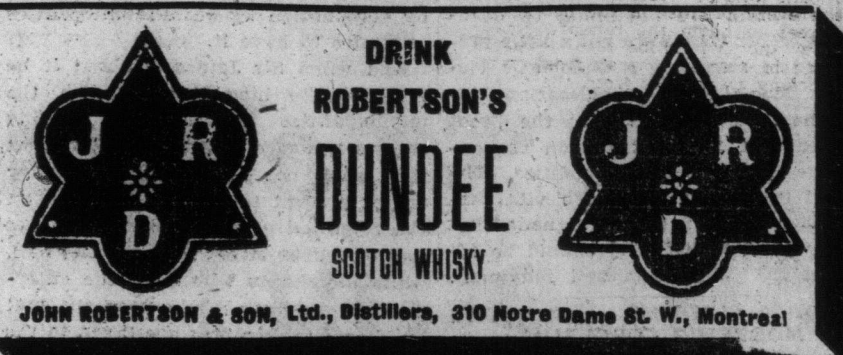
