Refusal of Castro to Recognize French Representative Will Be

Washington, D.C., Jan. 9.—President Castro's failure to recognize the French charge at Caracas on New Year's Day will not be allowed to pass unnoticed by the French government. At the request of the French government, Mr. Ruissell, the American minister at Caracas, will make to President Castro vigorous and, what may prove to be final, representations.

The French government's position is that it has exhibited sufficient patience.

Meantime the French fleet is in the West Indies, awaiting the turn of events. A conference between United States Secretary of State Root and M. Jusserand, the French ambassador, is scheduled for this week, by which time the hope is expressed here that the answher of President Castro will have been received and France will be enabled to shape her course.

FIGHTING INSURGENTS.

St. Petersburg, Jan. 9.—Col. Makein, comandant at Rostoff-on-Don, the graphed to-night the details of a smart action, in which the insurgents in that vicinity were driven from their fortified stronghold in Zatermernitzk. The insurgents had dug intrenchments and erected barricades and were prepared to offer a house to house resistance, but they were driven out by the combined use of artillery, infantry and cavairy and fied, leaving most of their weapons.
