BEEKEEPERS' MEET

Because Fruit Growers Spray Their Trees While in Bloom.

President Holman of the Ontario Beekeepers' Association and Mr. Gemmill of the Perth County Beekeepers' Association, waited on the Minister of Agriculture, Hon. John Dryden, yesterday and complained that many people had sprayed their apple trees this year while they were in full bloom.

As a result, a number of bees have been killed by the Paris green contained in the spraying mixture.

Mr. Dryden pointed out that the spraying of fruit trees while in bloom is contrary to law, and that there is a heavy penalty for so doing. Further, the Minister stated that the spraying of trees in bloom was ineffective any way, being a pure waste of time and material.

Mr. Dryden promised to call upon attention to the law and its enforcement.

It may be mentioned that fruit-growers and beekeepers are of great service in aiding the "settling" of fruit.

The State Board of Arbitration held a conference with the officials of the Cleveland Stone Co. this morning, with the object of recognizing the strikers. They have refused to recognize the strikers. A body of Poles from Newburg, Ohio, are ready to take the places of the strikers after Monday.

If these men go to work in place of the strikers a bloody fight is anticipated.
