DIRECTORY'S 6357 MORE NAMES.
 There Are 1305 Fewer Vacant Houses—Increase in Population Last Year 10,071.
 Mr. J. M. Night, president and managing director, states in his preface to the City Directory for 1899:
 "Our beautiful city is gradually getting over the effects of the late boom in real estate which hampered so many of our best business men and kept them from taking part in great undertakings for the advancement not only of Toronto, but of our great Dominion, which is now in a fair way of making great strides in the very near future.
 "Our population is steadily increasing, our vacant houses and stores, so much talked about in the past, are steadily disappearing. We have now a population of at least 250,000 in Toronto proper, without counting any of our many suburbs. With the deepening of our canals and entrances to our harbor, and the extension of railway lines reaching out to greater distances, and the opening up of the new railway lines in our northern country, Toronto will have not a boom, but a very rapid growth and increase in business."
 "The actual increase in the individual names in our 1898 Directory over our 1898 is 6357. This multiplied by the number of three inches our increase for last year 10,071 our total number of individual names, without those who have vacated offices, but on the whole the showing is good."
JUST WHAT UNCLE SAM WANTS.
Germans Will Have to Build Extra Factories in the States.
 Berlin, Jan. 14.—The manufacturers in this country of iron, steel, tin, and copper, and chocolate have appealed to the Government to try to induce the Washington authorities to rescind the latest interpretation of the tariff agreement. These articles, which they claim is unfair and will ruin their export trade to America, and compel them to erect special factories in the United States.

EIGHT PASSENGERS HURT.
Big Tree Fell Down the Mountain and Caused a Train Wreck.
 Cortland, N.Y., Jan. 14.—The Fall Brook Railway passenger train, No. 6, was wrecked at Pine Station, Pa., on the Pine Creek division, at 3.30 o'clock this afternoon. A huge tree came down the mountain side, and struck the train, raising it from a 20-foot embankment to the side of the river. Eight passengers were slightly injured, but all were able to be taken to their homes.
Toronto Magnetic Observatory.
 At the Canadian Institute on Saturday evening, Mr. B. F. Stewart read some notes on the history of the Toronto Observatory, and described the troubles which have been the cause of the removal of the magnetic instruments to a point on the north shore of the Observatory at Agincourt was completed early in September, and regular observations were begun there on Oct. 1. The instruments all record photographically, and the traces are sent each day to Toronto to be developed, and are then returned to the Observatory to be measured and results tabulated. There will be but one observer permanently stationed at the new building, but the director and some of his assistants pay periodical visits in order to make absolute determinations of the various magnetic forces.

WANNAPITAE DISTRICT.
Activity in Gold Mining Near Sudbury Foreeshadowed for Spring.
 Wannapitae, Dec. 13.—Important developments are expected to take place in this district during the spring. The directors and all shareholders of the Central mine have arranged to instal an 80-hp. engine, and additional stamps. The Mountain Mining Co. has purchased several pieces of complete 10-stamp mill, which will be in running order in the spring. This company erected a mill at this place in 1897, which was all privately subscribed, and none is now to be had on the market. Parties from Duluth have purchased several pieces, and have bonded others at large figures. Already several large forces are at work in the spring. Several other parties have been doing winter work in the district, and intend to start very early in the spring. The Moore is still idle, but when the Hignation mine is started, the district will no doubt be started upon it. This district was held back owing to the Government having refused to purchase several about a year ago, on account of the valuable pine in the district; but the ore is much richer than in any other district in Ontario and closely resembles that of Central. The geological conditions are closely similar in many respects. There being a number of extinct craters to be seen.
