Mr. Justice Britton Says the Trial Must Take Place in Toronto, Instead of Here.

MAY HAVE TO HELP BRING DEFENSE WITNESSES

[Special to The Advertiser.]

Toronto, May 7.—The motion for a change of venue in the London election case was this morning refused by Mr. Justice Britton.

The judgment was handed out at Osgoode Hall, when the motion was argued yesterday by Mr. E. F. B. Johnston, K.C., counsel for the defendants. and Mr. Lynch-Staunton, of Hamilton, who will act as crown prosecutor.

In his judgment, Mr. Justice Britton stated that the danger of jurors being influenced is no greater here than in London. In regard to the question of expense, his lordship declared that if the defense cannot finance the bringing of their witnesses to Toronto, the crown will have to assist.

It is understood that the trial will not take place until the fall.

The evidence of Mr. W. T. R. Preston, who is now in the Far East, can obtained until next month, and as there are no high courts sitting in July and August, it will be impossible to bring the cases to trial until after



### Gamble on Life.

Santa Monica, Cal., May 7 .-- A stake of \$80,000 played against a fortune of nearly \$1,500,000 with a human life as its final determining factor, are features of an unusual transaction entered into yesterday between Henry C. Keating and a syndicate composed of four local men.

In about three years, ie he lives. Keating will fall heir to \$1,500,000 of an estate to be settled at that time, when the younger heirs will become of age. The syndicate gave Keating \$80,-000 for his interest in the estate, taking the risk of losing the \$80 .-000 if Keating died before the estate is settled, as the other heirs then come into the whole estate of \$5,000,000.

Should Keating survive, the settlement of the estate, the syndicate will make \$1,420,000, less the interest on the \$80,600, and various legal fees.

### NEW LAW MAY KILL THE MOVE TO ANNEX SECTION EAST OF CITY

Council Thought It Would Be Easy Matter-Petition Must Come From District Affected.

That it will not be all plain-sailing or the city in the matter of annexing the district to the east of the city known as part of the St. Lawrence ward of London Township, is quite apparent. The council some time ago asked City Solicitor Meredith for instructions as to how to proceed to effect the annexation, and Mr. Meredith's answer is as follows:

"I beg to call your attention to the hange in the law which has been made respecting annexation of part of a township to a city. By the amendment made to the municipal act in the year 1906, it is now necessary that the majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the township proposed to annexed to the city shall petition the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council to add such portion to the city.

"Unless the ratepayers in the portlon of the township proposed to be annexed to the city will petition the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council to add that portion of the township to the city it will be useless to pass a resolution declaring that it is expedient that that portion of the township shall be annexed to the city."

#### BRITISH LORDS TALK REFORM

London, May 7.—The discussion in the House of Lords last night was devoted to Lord Newton's bill proposing the reconstitution of the House on a partly elective basis. He seeks to remove the excessive preponderance hereditary peers by stipulating qualification through service to the state or previous election, and he provides for a certain number of elected peers and for the nomination by the crown of life peers, these not to exceed 100

in number. The House as well as the galleries were thronged, showing the interest aroused by the Conservative proposal to anticipate Government action, and the possibility of the debate provoking a statement of the intentions of the Government. This, however, did not come to pass, the Earl of Crewe, lord president of the council, speaking on behalf of the Government, declining to have anything to do with Lord Newton's proposal. He gave no hint of the Government's plan, although his cryptic utterances on the subject conveyed the idea that the Government contemplated a somewhat drastic measure. ### MODIFIED FORM OF HOME RULE IN THE IRISH COUNCIL BILL

Secretary for Ireland Birrell Introduces Measure for an Administrative Council at Dublin.

### A CROWDED HOUSE AT EPOCH-MAKING INCIDENT

London, May 7 .- The Irish bill, designed to meet demands for Irish home rule, was introduced in the House of Commons today by the Chief Secretary for Ireland, Mr. Birrell, in the presence of an audience which crowded every corner of the chamber.

The bill provides "for the establishment of an administrative council" for Ireland, with headquarters at Dublin. The Irish secretary, and those in his confidence kept their secret well, with the result that the political curiosity was keen to learn the precise details of the scheme, which is likely to create a prolonged controversy.

Prior to the appearance of the measure it was popularly termed a "devolution bill," but its advocates refer to it as the "Irish Council Bill," owing to its creation of a council to take over a number of administrative features of Irish rule. But to Ireland and the general public the bill is "the Irish bill," with home rule presented in such new and modified form as to enlist the support of elements hitherto hostile.
