PLACES OF WORSHIP, SCHOOLS. &c.

Eastern Division.—County of Halifax—District of Halifax comprises the townships of Halifax, Dartmouth, Preston, and Lawrence Town. In this district there are about 25 places of worship, and 30 schools—The District of Colchester contains three townships, Truro, Onslow, and Londonderry, besides several settlements. It contains 13 places of worship: 2 established church of England, 10 Presbyterian, and 1 (at Onslow) for all denominations. Number of schools about 20.—District of Pictou, containing three townships, Pictou, Egerton and Mexwelton. There are 17 places of worship, nearly all Presbyterians, and about 25 schools.—County of Cumbertand, contains 2 townships, Amherst and Wallace. Places of worship, 8: viz 1 church of England, 1 Baptist, and 6 Methodist.—County of Sydney, contains 7 townships; Arisaig, Dorchester, St. Andrew, Tracadie, Manchester, Guysborough and St. Mary. It is divided into two districts, Upper and Lower. In the Upper District there are 18 places of worship, viz. church of England 3, Roman Catholic 11; Presbyterian 3, Baptist 1. Number of Schools 20, 17 receive government aid; 3 are female. The people pay £252 3 0, government £97 10s. per half year. No. of scholars 429, and 42 poor scholars. Antigonish, in this district contains 109 dwelling houses, besides barns and work shops. Population 509. Master tradesmen, &c. 5 blacksmiths, 6 carpenters, 8 shoomakers, 4 tailors, 4 wheelwrights, 3 saddlers, 4 tanners, 5 coopers, 1 tinsmith, 3 masons, 2 dep. land surveyors; and 2 saw mills, 3 grist mills, 2 oat kilns, 2 carding mills, 6 taverns, and 15 shops.—Lower District, places of worship, 4 church of England, 3 Boman Catholic, and 3 of other denominations.

MIDDLE DIVISION.—County of Hants.—This county contains 6 townships, Windsor, Newport, Rawdon, Kempt, Douglas and Falmouth; places of worship, 23.—King's County. Four townships, Horton, Cornwallis, Parrsboro', and Aylesford. Places of worship 18; 4 church of England, 2 Presbyterian, 6 Methodist, 5 Baptist, 1 Congregational. There are small schools within a mile of each other throughout the county.—Queen's County. Contains 2 townships, Liverpool and Guysborough. Places of worship, 1 church of Eng-
