NEW YORK FINANCIAL BUREAU.

Important sources expect a recovery in the stock market today. Purchases on weakness should be moderately profitable for discriminating daily operators.

Margin calls will likely cause a good deal of irregularity in the early trading today and we expect to see further weakness manifested through the list.

At the same time the technical position of the market has been materially strengthened by the events of the past few days.

As an moment the right kind of support is likely to make its appearance when short covering would bring about a decided rally.

We do not, however, look for an immediate resumption of the bull movement but rather expect the market to remain in a trading position backing and filling around present levels for a while pending a more definite idea as to the attitude of the most important interests.

For our part we believe that there has been no change in the bull programme and consequently believe that on all drives the leading rails at least are good purchasers for the profit.

Should the market get open unexpectedly strong, however, and advance sharply during the early trading we think stock may be sold for a turn.

We look, however, for very good support now in the Hill issues and in Paul, Loco and Steel are also receiving good support but we do not look for any real upward movement in industrials.
