it from Mr. William Enclosed please find report intraffide it from Mr. Will C. Shirfield re his inspection of C. F. Cox's operations on Lac Seul reservations.

MAY 23 1928

He wishes to go back again for another ten days to complete his work. I think it would be a good dies for him to do this.

Please let me know your instructions.

You will note Mr. Cox has left some men in his camps. These will probably see there are no fires.

We have also arranged for an indian, the chief's son to be a fire ranger.

I will ask the Ontario Forrestry Patrol to report anything that may happen on the reserve to me as they will be continuously flying over it.

If possible after treaty payments I will visit the camps.

As regards boomsticks cut from Keewatin Lumber Company's southern portion of reserve, the manager of the company informs me he will attend to this.

Er. Shirfield suggests there will be big operations on the reserve next winter and that a check scaler will be put on. I will discuss this matter with Mr. Paget when He is here.
