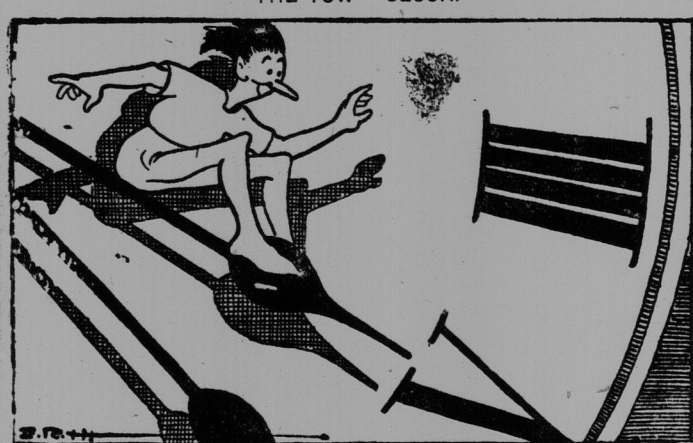

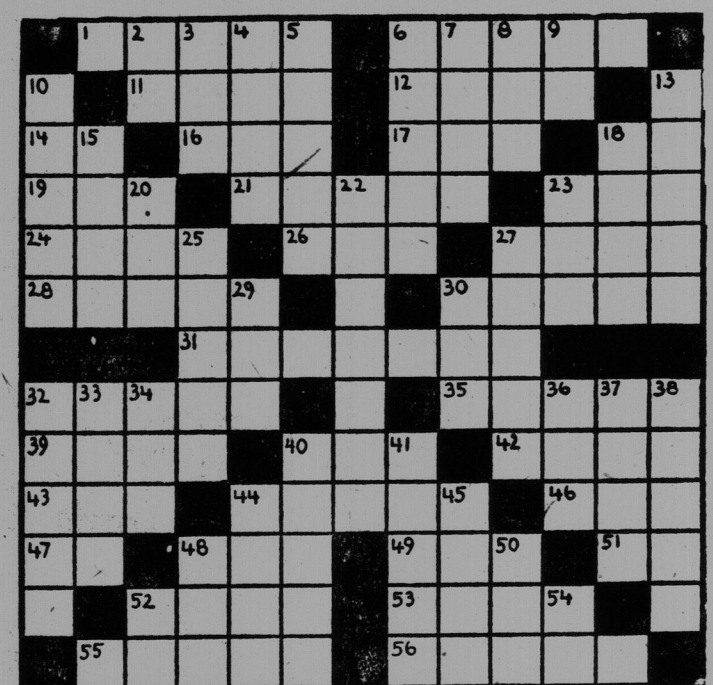

CROSS-WORD PUZZLE

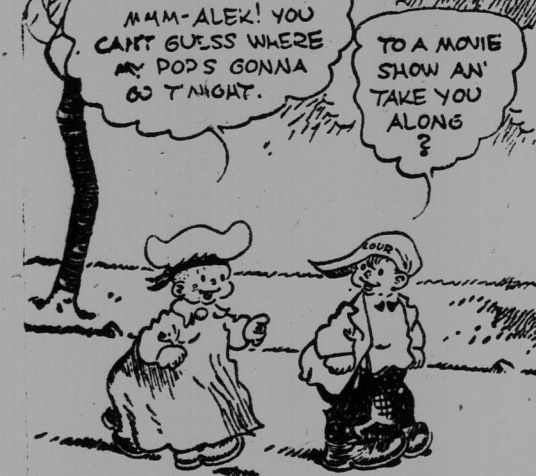


SUGGESTIONS FOR SOLVING CROSS-WORD PUZZLES

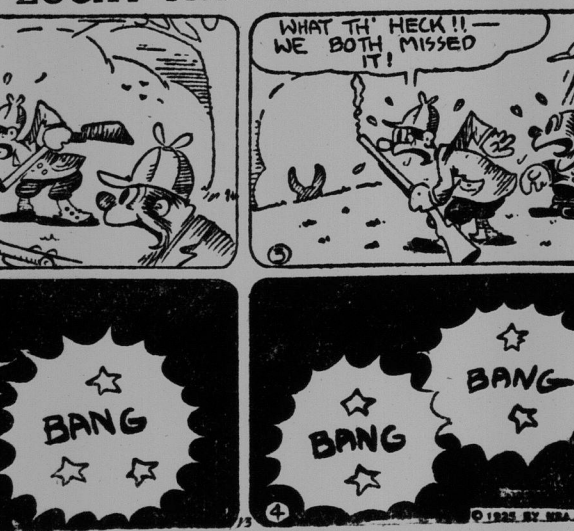

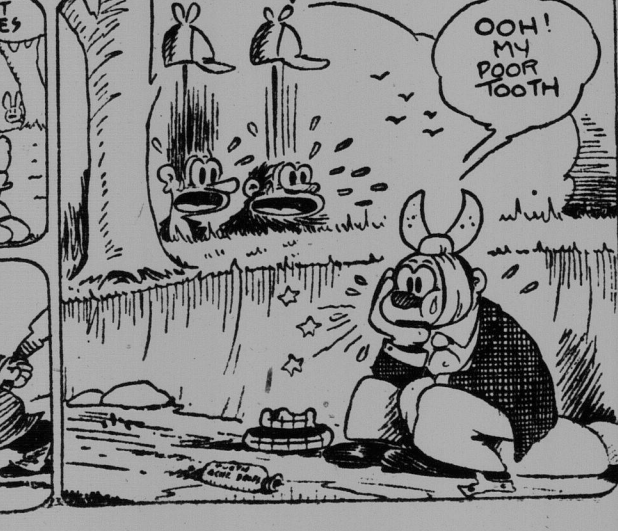

TO GET \$1,600,000

Canada Will Receive Share Under Dawes Plan During This Year.

LONDON, Jan. 15.—It is calculated that as the total German payment for the first annuity under the Dawes

plan will amount to \$250,000,000, the charges for the armies of occupation and other costs will be \$85,000,000, leaving \$165,000,000 for reparations, of which the British Empire's share will be \$86,250,000 and Canada's share, \$1,500,000 for the year ending Sept., 1925.
